



The purpose of this meeting was to address key concerns related to harassment, discrimination, and gender sensitivity on campus, while introducing the Internal Complaint Committee's (ICC) role in ensuring a secure environment. Additionally, discussions were held on the specific issues faced by female students, with the Presiding Officer's permission.

Meeting Highlights:

1. Introduction to the Role and Function of the ICC:

- The meeting commenced with a detailed explanation of the Internal Complaint Committee's (ICC) role by member secretary Ms. D. D. Jadhav in ensuring that the campus remains a safe and harassment-free space for all students.
- The Presiding Officer Mrs. D. S. Bhoite provided a briefing on how the ICC operates, emphasizing that it is committed to handling complaints in a confidential and professional manner.
- The students were informed of the committee's procedures and how they could approach it if necessary.

2. Education on Harassment and Discrimination:

- In the next segment of the meeting, Mrs. D. S. Bhoite ma'am focused on educating students about the various forms of harassment, including physical, verbal, emotional, and cyber harassment.
- The session was interactive, with students being encouraged to ask questions and clarify any doubts about what constitutes harassment and how they can report it.
- The committee also covered types of discrimination that could occur on campus and discussed how both harassment and discrimination could negatively affect the learning environment.

3. Promotion of Gender Sensitivity and Mutual Respect:

- An essential component of the meeting was the promotion of gender sensitivity and mutual respect among the campus community.
- Discussions were held on how students, faculty, and staff can work together to foster an environment that respects all individuals, irrespective of their gender.

4. Planning Future Workshops, Seminars, and Awareness Programs:

- The ICC outlined its plans to hold a series of workshops, seminars, and awareness programs to continue raising awareness on issues such as harassment, gender equality, and respect.
- It was proposed that these events be held regularly, involving experts in the field, legal advisors, and counselors.

5. Open Discussion on Girls' Problems (with Presiding Officer's Permission):

- With the permission of the Presiding Officer, the meeting allowed girl students to openly discuss issues they were facing on campus. Some of the major concerns raised included:
 - **Transport Facilities:** Students highlighted the lack of adequate transportation, especially during late hours, which made them feel unsafe when commuting to and from the campus.
 - **Hygiene and Sanitation:** There were complaints about the cleanliness and maintenance of the girls' washrooms, with students requesting better facilities and regular inspections to ensure hygiene standards are met.

- The ICC assured the students that their concerns would be taken up with the relevant authorities and that immediate action would be taken wherever possible.

6. How to Raise a Complaint

- **Direct Contact:** Approach the Presiding Officer or any other ICC member directly, either in person, by phone, or via email.
- **Formal Written Complaint:** A formal, written complaint must be submitted to the Presiding Officer. It is preferred as a hard copy or an email. The complaint should include:
 - I. Date and time of the incident(s).
 - II. Place where it occurred.
 - III. Name and contact information of the accused.
 - IV. Names and contact information of any witnesses.
 - V. A detailed description of the incident(s).
- **Timeline:** Complaints should ideally be filed within **3 months** of the incident, though this period may be extended if the committee is satisfied with the reasons for delay.
- **Assistance:** If the complainant is unable to file the complaint due to physical or mental incapacity, a relative, friend, co-worker, or other designated person can file on their behalf with their consent.

WOMEN'S DAY – COOKING COMPETITION REPORT





Subject: Report on Expert lecture for girls on '**Healthy Diet for Girls**'.

Objectives:

1. To develop and improve Women's health and understand the importance of Women's Health
2. To understand Women's common Health Issues causes, symptoms, and its remedial actions.
3. To encourage women for use of Ayurved and healthy Lifestyle.

Introduction:

The Internal Complaint Committee of our institute organized an expert talk on '**Healthy Diet for Girls**' on 9th June 2025, from 3.00 PM to 5.00 PM. The event aimed to spread awareness among students and staff regarding common women's health issues and the role of Ayurveda in managing them.

The program commenced at 3.00 PM with felicitation of Hon. Guest Dr. Sonali Gundage Madam by the Prof. Mrs. Jyoti Tilekar. An introductory speech of the guest was delivered by Ms. Dipali Jadhav, Member Secretary of ICC.

Expert Talk by Dr. Sonali Gundage:

Dr. Sonali began her session by discussing the common health issues women face in their daily lives due to lifestyle choices and family responsibilities. She elaborated on how to differentiate between normal and abnormal health conditions in women.

She discussed general causes and symptoms of several health problems such as:

- PCOD (Polycystic Ovarian Disease)
- Hormonal Imbalances
- Skin Issues (e.g., acne, dry skin, sun damage, skin cancer)
- Hair Problems (e.g., dandruff, hair loss, premature greying)
- Stress and Menstrual Issues (e.g., heavy, scanty, missed or irregular periods, period cramps)

She explained specific symptoms for conditions like PCOD, including:

- Irregular menstruation
- Absence or skipping of periods
- Heavy menstrual bleeding

Dr. Sonali also covered common hair and skin conditions, highlighting how environmental factors and daily habits contribute to these problems.

Remedies, Preventive Measures & Healthy Diet Tips:

Dr. Sonali provided **general remedies** to address these issues during their early stages. For more severe cases, she recommended **natural and Ayurvedic treatments**. She emphasized the importance of:

- **Yoga**
- **Meditation**
- **Balanced Diet**
- **Physical Exercise**

Details on Healthy Diet for Girls:

Dr. Sonali stressed that a healthy diet is one of the most effective ways to prevent hormonal imbalances and other common health issues. She suggested:

- **Iron-rich foods** to combat anaemia: green leafy vegetables (spinach, methi), dates, jaggery, pomegranate, and beetroot.
- **Calcium-rich foods** to strengthen bones: milk, curd, paneer, sesame seeds, almonds, and ragi.

- **Protein sources** for muscle repair and hormone regulation: eggs, pulses, sprouts, tofu, and legumes.
- **Fruits and vegetables** for vitamins and antioxidants: seasonal fruits like guava, oranges, papaya, banana, and vegetables like carrot, broccoli, and bottle gourd.
- **Hydration:** Drink plenty of water and include herbal teas or Ayurvedic drinks like *ashwagandha* or *shatavari milk*.
- **Avoid junk food and sugary snacks**, as they lead to weight gain, acne, and mood swings.
- **Inclusion of healthy fats** like ghee, flax seeds, walnuts, and olive oil to support brain and hormonal health.

She encouraged girls to follow **regular meal timings**, avoid skipping breakfast, and maintain a diet that supports energy, immunity, and menstrual health.

Interactive Session:

After the session, students had the opportunity to ask questions related to their personal health concerns. Dr. Sonali provided valuable and practical guidance during this interactive segment.

Finally, Mrs. Dhanashri Bankar, Member of ICC, concluded the event by vote of thanks and by encouraging all attendees to prioritize their health through proper care and nutrition. She reiterated the significance of a healthy lifestyle in daily life.

The session concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. D. S. Bhoite, Presiding Officer, ICC.







The purpose of this meeting was to address key concerns related to harassment, discrimination, and gender sensitivity on campus, while introducing the Internal Complaint Committee's (ICC) role in ensuring a secure environment. Additionally, discussions were held on the specific issues faced by Ladies staff, with the Presiding Officer's permission.

Meeting Highlights:

1. Introduction to the Role and Responsibilities of ICC:

The meeting commenced with a detailed explanation of the ICC's mandate, which is to ensure a safe and supportive campus environment. The ICC member secretary Ms. D. D. Jadhav

explained the complaint procedures and assured committee's confidentiality and commitment to addressing all grievances, particularly those related to harassment and discrimination. The importance of the committee's work in maintaining a harassment-free campus was emphasized.

Summary:

Total 100 degree students from(FY Degree)attended the seminar, where host of the program was **Adv. Shirin Shaha**,who educated students ,faculties about women security , their rights and laws for legal protection. The session aimed to foster a deeper understanding of the issues faced by women in Indian society and the mechanisms in place to combat them. This workshop was organized under the **Institute's Internal Complaint Committee**.

The following pointers were covered during this session:

Legal Framework Protecting Women in India

- The speaker provided an overview of laws addressing crimes against women, including:
 - **The Indian Penal Code (IPC):** Sections dealing with offenses like rape (Section 376), molestation (Section 354), domestic violence, dowry harassment, and stalking.
 - **The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005:** Aimed at protecting women from physical, emotional, and financial abuse within the home.
 - **Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013:** Guidelines for the protection of women against workplace harassment.
- Recent amendments and legal reforms that have strengthened women's rights, such as the 2013 Criminal Law Amendment, were discussed.
- The speaker also highlighted the role of legal institutions like **National Commission for Women (NCW)** and **State Commissions for Women** in ensuring justice.

Psychological Impact of Offenses Against Women







Then Ms. Vaibhavi Nikam, the in-charge of Nirbhaya Pathak, conducted an informative session where she elaborated on various laws applicable to both girls and boys. She discussed:

- The legal framework surrounding women's safety in India.
- Key provisions under laws such as the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, and the POCSO Act.
- The importance of understanding one's rights and seeking help when needed.

She further explained the role and responsibilities of the Nirbhaya Pathak team within the engineering college. She emphasized the initiatives taken by Nirbhaya Pathak to ensure a safe environment, including regular patrolling, awareness programs, and assistance in grievance Redressal.

The session also included an interactive segment where students had the opportunity to ask questions and share their concerns. Ms. Nikam and her team addressed queries related to legal aid, complaint filing procedures, and emergency helpline numbers available for assistance. The discussion helped students gain a clearer understanding of their rights and the measures they can take in case of any untoward incidents.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by ICC Member Secretary, Ms. D. D. Jadhav. She expressed gratitude towards the resource persons for their valuable insights and appreciated the participation of students and faculty members. She reiterated the commitment of the Internal Complaint Committee to continue conducting such awareness programs to foster a secure and supportive educational environment.
